Understanding Your Care

You have the right Get care without being judged

Know your test results and what they mean

Choose or refuse any procedure, test, or treatment

Have anything explained to you

Your Privacy

Your doctor CANNOT tell your parents, or anyone who is not helping to give you health care, about your sexual health visit, unless YOU say so. There are some exceptions to this rule. The doctor may need to tell someone to help keep you safe, if they think:

- Someone is hurting you
- ightarrow You might hurt someone else, or yourself
- You're age 15 or younger and you have an older sex partner (especially a much older one)
